Thank you for continuing to support our educators and for ensuring that your children are learning and experiencing normality in what is an extraordinary time.

Schools are still open

School will continue as usual next week but parents and families can choose to keep their children home if they wish. The advice of Australia's top health experts is that schools continue to be safe.

Monday 6 April – 9 April 2020

From Monday 6 April to Thursday 9 April 2020, teachers will be undertaking professional development days to prepare for the continued delivery of education in Term 2.

From Term 2, we know that teaching and learning will need to occur in a new way with flexible learning arrangements to be delivered to students which are tailored at the school-level and stage of schooling.

Our teachers need time to plan and prepare for this so that the transition to a new way of teaching and learning is more successful for your children.

Students will not be required to attend during this time, however, our schools will remain open for the children of workers who cannot make alternative arrangements and for any vulnerable children who may need to attend. No child will be turned away from school.

Schedule for Northern Territory Government Schools

DATE	EDUCATION PROVISION
26 March – 3 April	Learning will be delivered predominantly on school sites and families are welcome to continue to send their child/ren to school. Families may choose to keep their child at home and so far as is practicable, learning at home opportunities will be provided.
6 April – 9 April	Teachers will participate in professional development days to plan and prepare for learning at home in Term 2, 2020. Schools will remain open for children of essential service workers and for any vulnerable children who may need to attend.
10 – 17 April	Official school holiday break
