COVID-19

With the NT borders now open, we need to be more vigilant than ever in terms of COVID-19. At Acacia Hill School, we continue to ensure we implement the three principles of the NT Roadmap to the New Normal: personal responsibility, physical distancing and hygiene. Of course in a school, it is often not possible to implement physical distancing with our students, and schools are exempt, but with the requirement to do the best we can where possible. If your child is sick, we ask that you keep them home.

Changing situations

The situation continues to evolve and could change at any time. Like all NT schools, we have a pandemic plan and principals receive weekly briefings from the CE.

Adults coming into school:

Parents and Carers who walk their child to class may continue to do so.

NDIS Service Providers may visit students provided the NDIS providers in NTG schools documentation has all been completed and approved.

Tradies as far as possible, tradies will be asked to visit out of school hours.

If there is a change in the COVID-19 situation, such as local transmissions in Central Australia, we will follow advice as per our pandemic plan and our Department.

Visitors sign in - Visitors are now asked if they have been interstate in the previous fortnight when they sign in. It is assumed that if they have come from a hot spot, they will be in mandatory quarantine and if they have come from somewhere else, they are here because there are no concerns in the state they have come from. However, in the event of the situation changing, this may be useful information.
