Working Bee

Enrolment and Attendance

We currently have 101 students on the roll, with 76% attendance up to the end of Week 4.

Visit from NT Police Trainees

On Thursday 30th March, 12 NT police who are undertaking training in interviewing children and vulnerable people will visit Acacia Hill School. This training is to help officers better be able to support children and vulnerable young people in communicating crimes.

Trainees will spend about 40 minutes with our students, communicating and learning how each child communicates. A letter with more detail is attached to this newsletter. We had a similar visit a few years ago and it was a very happy and successful event for students. At that time, we hoped it could be an annual event, but it stopped during COVID-19. Participants in this course visit Forrest Parade School (special school in the Top End) twice yearly.





Dear Mrs Permezel Julie

I appreciate your time in assisting the Northern Territory Police with the continual education of our investigators to ensure we deliver the best service to the community. We appreciate the support the Northern Territory Police receives from the community and aim to keep our working relationship active.

Between 20 March and 31 March 2023, the Northern Territory Police Force will be facilitating a course in Alice Springs for Investigators which is focussed on interviewing children and vulnerable people. During the course, the investigators learn about memory retention and recall, the impact of trauma, legislation for procedures surrounding interviewing children and vulnerable people, questioning styles, cultural considerations, understanding neurodiverse people and how to communicate effectively, information from speech pathologists and protective behaviours. The participants also meet with primary school students from another school where they have to interview the children on a 'memory event' that has been created by our staff two weeks earlier. Some of these memory events in the past have been about days out to the show, a day at the beach, losing a toy or pet and finding it and going on holidays.

Another aspect of the course is introducing the participants to children from neurodiverse backgrounds that they may not have previously done so in the past. Our aim is to normalise that some people are not neurotypical and that is okay. All children are entitled to feel safe and report crimes and we want to break down any barriers from the past where officers have been too timid to engage with the children for fear of 1) tainting a child's evidence for a court hearing, and 2) that they cannot effectively communicate with neurodiverse people.

To assist us in breaking down any barriers, we are seeking assistance from your students to meet with our investigators for up to one hour on Thursday 30 March 2023 at 9:00am. During this time, the investigators will talk to the students and learn that each person communicates in different ways. They will be asked to communicate with the students about their favourite activities, classes, sports and toys, while doing an activity the student has chosen (playground). There is no 'memory event' and no pressure towards the children in any way. If they do not want to communicate on the day, that is okay. We all have days where we don't want to communicate!

I hope you can reach out to the parents of your students and seek their approval for this interactive morning with the class. We aim to keep this a fun experience for the students and have them take home a good experience with the police officers they have met.
