On Country Learning Measure

The On Country Learning measure was announced through the 2023-24 Federal Budget as part of the better, safer future for Central Australia plan. It is a commitment of \$40M over 2023-24 and 2024-25 to support improved attendance and engagement at the 46 government and non-government schools in the Central Australian region. In line with the broader Central Australian response, the underlying principle is for community-driven responses, with community engagement as a core component of delivery.

On Country Learning means different things to different communities. It refers to ideas such as providing flexible approaches for learning that support two-way learning opportunities, fostering culturally responsive learning environments, inviting Indigenous language and culture into the day-to-day delivery of curriculum, and where local community members and organisations are engaged in the design and implementation of learning and activities with a focus on student engagement.

Acacia Hill School has been given some money for this initiative. We have some ideas for using the money and would love to have your feedback:

- 1. Pathways for young people with very high needs from remote Central Australia
 - for example, so they can attend Acacia during school terms and go home to country in holidays some families have said they want an option like this. This may involve a partnership with Territory Families and NDIS providers.
 - An additional staff member who could release staff to visit remote schools and mentor staff in supb. porting the child.

- 2. Pathways for young people with high behaviour needs to the point of a safety issue for other students and staff employ additional staff who can work with these young people one-on-one, either at school or at home.
- 3. Teacher shortage issue: five of our SESOs have commenced studying a Bachelor of Education. When they have to do a placement, currently they have to do this as Leave Without Pay. I am proposing a sort of 'internal scholarship' so they could be paid while on placement and also could work 0.8 so they can progress through the B Ed more quickly.
- 4. Reinstate a Secondary Senior Teacher 1 to assist with
 - a. Modified NTCET
 - b. ASDAN Curriculum (life skills)
 - c. Transition from school including employment pathways
 - d. Pathways for young people with disability from Owen Springs back into school
- 5. Transition from satellite class to mainstream a teacher to work with students AND mainstream schools to support successful transitions.
- 6. A high quality sensory room with robust sensory equipment.
- 7. Central Arrernte words and signs taught across the school.
- 8. Re-start ASSPA Committees and employ an ARO
- 9. Specialist bikes
- 10. Nutrition program / renovate kitchen
- 11. Library expansion
- 12. Music studio
- 13. Gathering space with learning sessions for families food provided

We will have these ideas displayed during the 40th Birthday Event for your feedback.




